

Baptism Check List

We are so excited to witness the next step in your walk with Christ as you follow Him in Water Baptism. Here are a few things to keep in mind as you prepare:

- Please read the attached document “Water Baptism”, this will give you a good understanding of the Scriptural principles behind baptism. We will meet to answer questions and help you know what to expect when we have the Baptism during morning service.
- Prepare your heart, guard your heart. The enemy will try to distract you or discourage you from going through with this. Do it for the Lord, He will bless your obedience. *Matthew 10:32-33* “Whoever acknowledges Me before men, I will also acknowledge him before my Father in Heaven. But, whoever disowns Me before men, I will disown him before my Father in Heaven.”
- Invite any family members who would want to be there for your baptism.
- Things to bring:
 - Complete change of clothes and a towel.
 - Clothes you would like to be baptized in. We do not have robes. Men shorts and T-shirts are fine. Ladies wear a dark colored shirts and shorts.
 - Hair dryer, make-up etc. You may use the restrooms on either side of the baptistery to dress or either one of the offices.
- Please be prepared to give a short testimony as to why you want to be baptized or tell us what your relationship with Jesus means to you.
- Be at the Church by 9:00 AM so you can be directed where to go and when to get ready. We will show you which dressing rooms to use and so forth.
- After you come up out of the water, we will pray for you so don’t rush off. Many times, the Holy Spirit will fall upon individuals in a powerful way, so be open and expecting.
- We will do the baptism at the end of the service, after the message. The worship team will come up again for a song while baptism candidates go to the back to get ready.

Please let us know if there is anything we can do to assist you. We are praying for you not only for your baptism, but that you may grow in your love for God and understand with clarity His purpose for your life.
